

2003 West Milwaukee Night Parking Permit Regulations

1. No vehicle shall park on any public street in the village between the hours of **3:00 a.m.** and **6:00 a.m.** except with a valid West Milwaukee Night Parking permit or special permission from the police department.
2. All night parking is restricted to the even side of the street on the nights with an even calendar date before midnight, and the odd side of the street on nights with an odd calendar date before midnight. Exceptions: Where permitted, only on the west side of Miller Park Way and both sides of South 46 Street between West Scott Street and West Greenfield Avenue where permitted.
3. This permit is valid on both sides of South 38 Street and West Greenfield Avenue where the Village and the City of Milwaukee share boundaries AND on both sides of South 56 Street where the Village and City of West Allis share boundaries.
4. No vehicle shall park with or without a permit in violation of posted parking restrictions or in violation of Snow Emergency restrictions.
5. **Winter Regulations:** Night parking is prohibited, with or without a permit between December 1st and April 1st on West Beloit Road (4900 block to west limits), West National Avenue, West Greenfield Avenue, West Mitchell Street, West Burnham Street.
6. The following vehicles are not eligible for night parking permits:
 - Longer than 21 feet, wider than 6 feet or higher than 7 feet
 - Any vehicle defined by statute as a Camping Trailer, Dual Purpose Motor Home, Fifth Wheel Mobile Home, Mobile Home, Motor Bus, Motor Home, Motor Truck, Road Machinery, Road Tractor, School Bus, Semi-trailer, Trailer, Truck Tractor.
 - Any vehicle that has delinquent parking fines, any vehicle that is not currently registered with the Division of Motor Vehicles or any vehicle whose registration has been suspended by the Division of Motor Vehicles.
7. Night parking permits are not required on the following legal holidays: New Year's Day; Memorial Day; Independence Day; Labor Day; Thanksgiving Day; Christmas Day; and the first day of each week (Sunday) in any year, **however the alternate side parking rule must be followed.**
